- ¹White Soft Paraffin
- ¹Zeroderm Ointment
- ²Fifty:50 Ointment

Highly Flammable

Take care - Emollients that contain paraffin can soak into your clothes, bedding & dressings. Therefore this can make them more prone to catch on fire if they come into contact with a flame or spark.

(to be used in patients unresponsive to other emollients)

Antimicrobial

(with chlorhexidine & benzalkonium chloride)

- ¹Dermol 500 lotion (if skin often infected)

- **Urea** containing products maybe useful in very dry scaling conditions including Ichthyosis, Keratosis Pilaris and Hyperkeratosis (skin thickening) of the palms and soles.
- **Chlorexidine** containing products may very rarely cause an anaphylatic reaction.
- **Benzalkonium Chloride** containing products may cause skin irritation with long term use.
